Sarah is in charge of the staff and students at the Walker Building but there are lots of other staff who work in this building



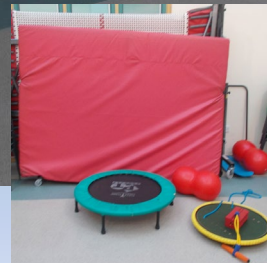
There is a board in reception to tell you which staff are in and which staff are out.



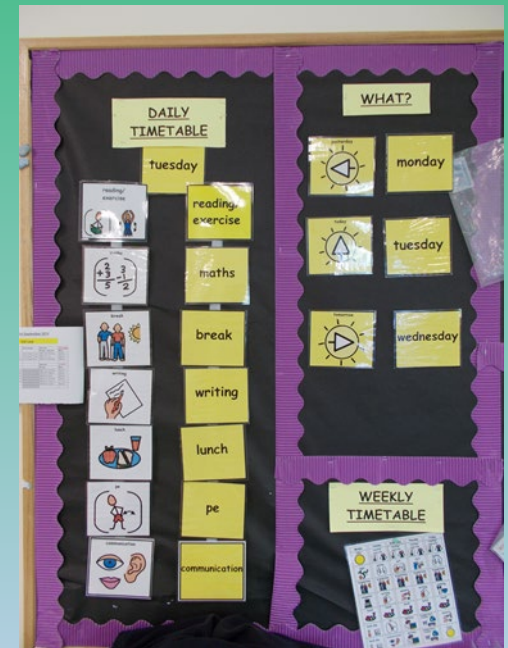
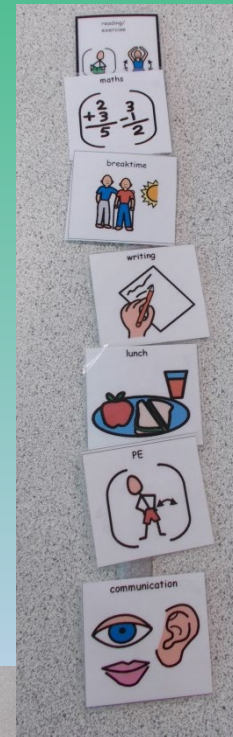
There are also lots of maps around the building to help you find your way around.
