(Tutor and Teacher of Computing) has agreed to lead this this provision with the support of Sarah O'Donnell. We are currently looking at arrangements to cover Andy's role within school. This is a very exciting development for us, as it means we have increased capacity to support children and young people with autism in the Tees Valley. Last but not least, Sue Rowney, Speech and Language Therapist has also made the difficult decision to retire. Sue has played a huge role in the development of staff skills over the year and she is a vital part of the team. For that reason we have managed to persuade her to remain during the Autumn Term, to work alongside Kate Reader (our other SaLT). Kate will then increase her days of working so that we still offer the same number of hours of SaLT support.
